AMANDA'S

STORY

"My next step will be praying with people-particularly with patients in the operating room."

Amanda grew up in a Christian family-she attended church her whole life and went to Open Door Christian Schools. Venturing into adulthood and her career as a nurse at Cleveland Clinic, she found herself wanting to take more ownership of her faith, but wasn't sure where to start. Leading up to the What's Your Next Step Excursion, she determined she should take the Next Step Survey.

The results hovered like a cloud in her mind, but she still couldn't see past the fog to discern what she should do. However, soon after taking the survey, she met with a patient in the OR as they were preparing for surgery. Amanda left the room because the patient seemed fine, but in reality, the patient was struggling. "By the time I came back with the rest of the team, she was crying," Amanda said. "I was kicking myself for the rest of the day for not being there for her when she obviously needed someone."



"That same evening, I met with my Next Step Coach. I told her that story and how burdened and convicted I felt for not doing or saying something. At that moment, I had a burst of clarity: My next step will be praying with people-particularly with patients in the OR." Amanda knew that this was going to be a stretching step for her. Being an introvert, she prefers to pray in private. In addition, she was concerned about how her coworkers might react.

However, Amanda was willing to get out of her comfort zone in order to grow. The next morning, she prayed in her car before work. "I asked God to open my heart and grant me courage to care for His people any way I know how." Later in the day, they brought another patient into the OR. This time, while the anesthesia team was preparing their meds, Amanda leaned in and asked how the patient was doing.

The patient admitted that she was nervous; then, she looked Amanda in the eyes and said, "Please be praying for me." Amanda saw God opening a window, and she asked the patient if it would be okay for her to pray with her instead. The patient nodded; Amanda held her hands while she prayed over her. Reflecting on the experience, Amanda said, "I can honestly say I felt like the Holy Spirit took over. There were six other people in that room; but at that moment, I didn't care if they heard me or not. I didn't even care if it was against the rules or not. All the noises drowned out, and it was just me, the patient, and the Father."

Once Amanda finished praying, the patient had a countenance of peace rather than nerves; she said, "It's in His hands." Amanda continued to hold her hand as she fell asleep.

"I still need to work on getting out of my comfort zone, but that incident confirmed that this is the next step that God wants me to take," Amanda declared.



At the beginning of the year, Dan was not a Christian, and his life was spiraling. He and his wife lived in Oregon; they considered relocating three hours south to Bend, Oregon. There, Dan might have an opportunity to pursue his creative passions and start a business, but he knew in his gut that he was moving in the wrong direction. He was out of a job, his health was declining, he was having chronic nightmares, and felt attacked everyday.

"I was very lost in life," Dan said. "We planned to take a trip to check out Bend and a local Community Makerspace to see if that was the place we wanted to live and start a business. But, the night before we left. I found myself saving aloud, 'God, I need a clear sign from youso clear that I cannot miss it. What am I to do? What do I need to do?"

The next morning, they visited the Oregon coast to see the beach before heading inland to Bend. A pile of logs and an out-of-place hat were positioned at the beach entrance. Dan paid the oddity no mind, but his wife pointed it out, so Dan took a closer look: the hat bore an embroidered bird and the words "Be Free Woodworking." Something about it stuck with him, and he remembered his prayer from the previous night. Was this the clear sign for which he had asked God?

God did not leave Dan wondering for long. Upon arriving at the Community Makerspace at Bend, he heard a fluttering in the engine. "I get out and I see a bird behind the grill: I pop open the engine and the bird flies out. I think back to the hat at the beach, and I was amazed. Only God could orchestrate that. I knew nothing was a coincidence."





Dan moved to Bend and started his own studio at the Makerspace, but he had not fully surrendered to the Lord, and he was miserable. "The Devil attacked me at every turn," Dan said. "The day before I was supposed to start building things, all my tools got stolen, and my health was getting so bad that I would spend my days with my face on the ground, unable to do hardly anything."

He had reached the lowest of lows, but there was a glimmer of hope. "Out of desperation, I gave my life to Jesus. He had been knocking at the door the whole time, and I had faith that he could save me." Within two weeks, he moved to Ohio where God led him to Church of the Open Door. Over the course of several months, God pieced Dan's life back together: his health was restored: his deepest wounds were healed; and he began growing as a disciple of Jesus. Any time Dan would doubt the direction he was going, birds would hit Dan's car again!

"The Lord keeps developing me through Church of the Open Door and helping me serve others as I am learning who God created me to be. I am more free and happy than I have ever been in my life-all because of Jesus."





STORIES FROM THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

GABRIEL'S STORY

I have been a Christian since 2015. Early on, I was a part of a group called "La Vid" (The Vine). It was where I grew and was discipled as a Christian, though my mother church was in San Pedro. For some of us, the group was all we had, and at that time, it was enoug; however, for various reasons, La Vid stopped meeting, so many of us did not have a place to gather with brothers and sisters in Christ. For me, the closest thing I had was the San Pedro church, which was hard for me to get to every Sunday. I started visiting various churches around my neighborhood, but I wasn't ready to leave my San Pedro church.

During that time, I was able to be a part of a missionary camp, which is where I met Cheo. He's a member of the Kefale church* (some of you might know him, since he is the driver at the church). As we talked to each other, we found out that he not only lives a 15-minute walk from my house but also that his church (Kefale) is right behind his house–so I said, "Alright, let's go!"

I visited Kefale on a Wednesday, and when I arrived, I found out that I already knew some people there: Pastor Tito, with whom I was going to take piano lessons but never did, and Yireth, who attended the same missionary camp that I did. Aside from that, everyone in Kefale church welcomed me as if I were their family! A month later, they invited me to sing at their Christmas event.

It has been a journey–an amazing one. This is the first time I can say for sure that I belong to a local church. The spiritual growth I am having cannot be described in words. I might not completely understand God's purposes–I still love my first spiritual family, but God has something here for me at Kefale. As I tell everyone that asks, "I am here to serve, and I want to do God's will."



CELIMAR'S STORY

I am so grateful to the Lord for Las Brisas Proclama program—they have provided support and allowed me to have a place to belong. I remember joining the program in 2016 like it was yesterday. We started to meet under a tree, and with time, other kids joined as well, so we needed more space to meet. That's when Maria–better known as "Nuna"–found us a big house, and as we grew even bigger, she found an even bigger house: "Casa Blanca."

At Casa Blanca, we started to learn valuable skills through classes like English, music, and sewing. Even though COVID introduced some challenges along the way, we are now able to do many activities without issues in a new area, and I praise God for providing food during that time! Now, I am part of the team and I have the blessing of pouring back into the program that made me who I am today. My job is to create a list of all the kids in the program, take their numbers and contact them, connect with their parents and pray for them, and decorate the place!

DIVINE'S STORY

Divine Niyonsenga was an orphan living in Nyanza lac in the south of Burundi. She got married at a young age, but her husband and his family disparaged and rejected her with such ferocity that she fled to live on the streets. She found herself with no options; she had to sell her body in order to survive. For five years, Divine was caught in a cycle of hunger, desperation, and prostitution in order to provide for herself and her three children. Her future seemed as if it were decided for her–how could she ever dig herself out of this hole?



"I have been changed and I have also changed others!"

Everything changed when she met a group of people at Kickoff to Hope that told her about Jesus, and for the first time in her life, Divine discovered that she had value. She was made in the image of God, and He loved her so much that He sent His Son to pay the penalty of all her sin-and she could have a relationship with Him!

Jesus transformed Divine's mind, desires, and purpose. Through Kickoff to Hope, Divine acquired a sewing machine. She learned to be a seamstress instead of a prostitute.



Divine has continued to be discipled, and she is now sowing seeds of the Gospel in her own community. In fact, she leads two groups (60 women total) that are called Abanyamahoro ("People of Peace") and Tuve mu buja dukore vyiza ("Leave Bad Jobs and Do Good Ones").

Divine shares God's Word and encourages them through life's struggles. She has led 15 of these ladies to Jesus and 12 of them out of prostitution. Together, they have found belonging and life transformation; to God be the glory!





YEAR-END GIVING PROJECT

Kickoff to Hope in Burundi, Africa

(The poorest country in the world as per GDP per capita, and considered one of the least developed countries. Burundi was ranked as the World's saddest nation by the most recent World Happiness Report.)

The mission of Kickoff to Hope in Burundi is to help develop impoverished and disadvantaged people in two ways: to find Jesus and to help them build a sustainable future. For the last several years, God has led the ministry to assist hundreds of vulnerable women (such as former prostitutes who accepted Jesus, abandoned women, widows, etc.). All these women are now being discipled as well as trained in different skills (sewing, shoe making, agriculture, etc.) as a means to provide for themselves and their families. This is accomplished in partnership with the local church.

One of the main needs that these women are now facing is safe housing! Many of them live with their entire family in a small straw hut. This is very dangerous as fire can quickly destroy these make-shift homes making it very difficult for the children to get out quickly. These houses are also prone to leak or are destroyed during the rainy season. This then results in leaving these families homeless and exposed to the elements.

It is our goal to bless the women and their families in Burundi with 15 houses! Each house costs \$1,500.
